5. MODE OF ADMISSION

1. Admission to BA/B.Com 1st year will be made on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination (10+2). The reservation of seats to various categories and sub categories will be applicable as per the reservation roster of HPU / H.P. Government.
2. Admission to BA/B.Com 2nd Year and 3rd year will be made on roll basis, who are otherwise eligible without waiting for final result. However, he/she will have to fulfil all the formalities laid down by the college administration like filling up of admission form and depositing the prescribed fees etc. This will help to start the regular teaching of 1st, 2nd and 3rd Year.

6. GENERAL ADMISSION RULES AND PROCEDURE

1. Fill up the admission form in your own handwriting and get it signed by parent/ guardian (guardian means only blood relation but he/she should not be a student of this college).
2. The students seeking admission in 1st year may apply in more than one "Core Elective Subjects" specifying their preference order in the admission form.
3. Attach two copies of latest passport size photographs to be pasted on the admission form and bio-data card, self-attested copies of School Board/University certificates from matric onwards, character certificate (original) last attended, SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/physically handicapped, sports/cultural certificate.
4. Attach photocopy Migration Certificate from School Boards other than H.P.B.S.E. Dharamshala.
5. In case of any gap for one or more years in academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence/ undertaking as a proof of his/her activities during the gap period and character certificate (should have been issued within the last 6 months on the day of submission of application) from any Gazetted Officer/ Panchayat Pradhan.
6. Come with original documents and parents/local guardian at the time of admission/counselling.
7. The admission to 1st year will be on the basis of merit as per reservation roster as per the seats are limited in all departments.
8. Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach a self attested copy of disability certificate issued by competent authorities.
9. Self attested photocopy of Himachal Domicile certificate for tuition fee concession (Girl students only).
10. Fresh applicant must not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl student only) as on 01-07-2022. However, the Vice Chancellor, H.P. University can permit age relaxation for reason to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of six months. Relaxation for SC/ST Students: Relaxation of 3 years of age for determination of upper age limit for admission.
11. Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
12. Students are advised to pay their dues personally on the dates notified from time to time, failing which his/her claim for admission will be forfeited and seat(s) so vacated will be allotted to the next candidate in the merit. Fees and funds once deposited will not be refunded.
13. Fee structure can be changed / modified as per the directions/instructions of higher authorities.
14. A student expelled from any college/ university or found involved in any in disciplinary activities in the preceding years will not be admitted to the college.
15. The students having compartment in 10+2 examination are not eligible for admission under CBCS (Choice Based Credit System).
16. If the candidate got admitted by furnishing wrong information or by concealing the facts, his/her admission will be cancelled on detection of such fault by college/university.

7. REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

1. Students who fail in all subjects or fails twice in a class will not be admitted to the class. However, if he/she opts to change the faculty, he/she may be admitted in the 1st year of the changed new faculty, if otherwise eligible.
2. Candidates having a stay of more than six years at any college will not be admitted.

4. The students who failed or having compartment from other institution will not be admitted in the college.
5. In spite of the eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during previous years.
6. The Principal reserve the right to reject or cancel the admission of any student without assigning any reason(s) or explanation if situation warrants so.

8. DOCUMENTS AND CERTIFICATES REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION (FOR NEW ADMISSION ONLY)

The admission form along with bio-data card, Anti-Ragging undertaking and PTA membership form must be submitted along with the following documents:

- * Paste latest own passport size photographs and two photographs of his/her father /mother/ guardian.
- * Self attested copies of detailed marks sheet of matriculation examination onwards.
- * Category certificate for students seeking admission in 1st year against reserved seats.
- * Himachal domicile certificate (for girl students only).
- * School leaving - cum - character certificate (original)
- * Migration certificate (CBSE and out of state Students)
- * Photocopy of Aadhar Card.
- * Candidate's bank account number, name and IFSC code of bank.

Note:

- * **Internet results will be accepted only when candidate attach documentary proof showing the detail of marks obtained in the concerned examination.**
- * **The date of issue the character certificate should not be more than six months.**

9. CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

Instructions for admission to B.A./B.Com 1st year of UGC pass course under RUSA in new CBCS template of UGC for the academic session i.e. 2016-17 onwards:

1. The eligibility conditions regarding the age limit, pass percentage or minimum eligibility etc at the entry level to B.Com./B.A. remains the same as mentioned in the original HP University ordinance.
2. The formation of the units/ number of students in a class / subject remains the same as per the HP Govt. notification of 2015 i.e. first unit / section of subject will be 80 students and subsequent units / section of 60 each depending upon the availability of faculties in the colleges. The admission in different streams will be done as per the HPU roster.
3. Since the executive council of HP University has approved the CBCS template of UGC for the academic session 2016-2017 the combination of elective subject chosen as discipline specific course can be allotted / given to the students as per the availability of faculties in the subject and infrastructure in the respective colleges.
4. For students admitted w.e.f. 2016 onward, the minimum credits to be accumulated for the award of the degree in CBCS (UGC) are 132 for Pass course.

The discipline specified programme chosen by student shall be on choice based credit system, CBCS. The programme shall be considered completed when the student cumulates the requisite number of successful credits (passed) i.e. at least 132 credits for undergraduate degree.

1. Core Course: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a core course.
 2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
 - 2.2 Dissertation/Project: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/ support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/ faculty member is called dissertation/ project.
 - 2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective. P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement;

- i. Environmental Science and ii. English/MIL Communication.

These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands - on - training, competencies, skills, etc.

3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

Introducing research component in under-graduate courses project work/dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving/analyzing /exploring a real life situation /difficult problem. A project/dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A project/dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

11. STUDENTS COURSE WISE CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA) AND EVALUATION

1. All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

(I) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) = 30 Marks

Attendance = 5, Mid-term = 15, Assignment/Quiz/Seminar etc=10

(II) TERM END EXAMINATION (TEE) = 70 Marks.

2. Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): This would have the following components.

a. Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% lectures/tutorials/practical as a student having less 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End Year Examination.

* Provided that those having between 74 and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.

* Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by Medical Certificate from Government Hospital.

* Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in a prescribed co-curricular activities(e.g. NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.

* Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemption for co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.

b. Classroom Attendance Incentive:

Those having greater than 75% attendance will be awarded CCA marks as follows:

14. CODE OF CONDUCT

1 Attendance:

- i. Minimum 75% lecture attendance is compulsory for appearing in the Annual Examination.
- ii. A student who remains absent continuously for 7 days or more, his/her name will be struck off from college roll.
- iii. A student's name is struck-off twice then he/she will not be re-admitted to the college.
- iv. A student is liable to pay all dues and fines as long as he/she remains on the college rolls.

2 Leave Rules

- i. Application for any kind of leave on prescribed pro-forma should be submitted well in time.
- ii. Leave up to three days will be sanctioned by the tutor on the recommendation of concerned teacher.
- iii. Leave above three days up-to six days will be sanctioned by the senior tutor.
- iv. The leave for more than six days will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendation of the concerned subject teacher/senior tutor.
- v. Medical leave for a period of over 6 days the student must produce medical certificate.

* Students participating in inter-college competitions should note that the practice/ rehearsal timing should be either before the classes (Early Morning) or after classes (Evening) because all such activities form a part, but not the substitute of Academics/ studies.

3 Identity Card (I- Card)

- i. Every student will be issued an identity card. Every student must keep his/her I-card with him during college hours and the same has to be produced by student whenever required by the college authorities.
- ii. In case, the I-card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued only after an FIR is registered with the nearest police station and an original copy thereof is appended with such request.
- iii. Duplicate I-card will be issued after depositing Rs. 20/-.

4 General Conduct/ Discipline Rules

Any of the following activities will be considered a breach of discipline:

- i. Ragging in any form
- ii. Use of mobile phones by students on the campus is strictly banned (except specified areas). Defaulters will be penalized
- iii. Writing on the walls/ black-board/ rooms etc.
- iv. Possessing drugs and smoking on the college campus.
- v. Accompanying outsider to the college.
- vi. Coming without I-Card in the college.
- vii. Damaging the college property
- viii. Loitering around in the corridors resulting in disturbance to the classes.

Note: All the students are advised to read the Notice Boards regularly. All students must note that ragging inside/ outside the campus is a cognizable offence. In case, a student found guilty of indiscipline in any activity in any manner, the college administration shall take appropriate action against such offenders.

15. CAREER - GUIDANCE CELL

Career guidance, counselling and placement activities have become very important and integral part of the functioning of educational institutions in 21st century. It provides a number of opportunities to the educated youth with the objective of helping the student for making ideal career choices and providing them placement opportunities through campus interviews. A Career Guidance, Counselling Cell is also actively involved in such activities under the energetic team of experienced teachers.

The objective is to make aware students in all aspects of modern fields and to develop their communication skills and confidence. The college is making all efforts to strengthen the activities of career guidance and counselling in larger interest of the students by organizing frequent interactive sessions with them on regular basis and developing relation with business establishments so that more and more students get opportunities for gainful employment.

16. CLUB

1. **Rovers and Rangers:** The Bharat Scout and Guides is a voluntary organization. It is devoted to the development of the young generation and selfless service to the country. Young adults are enrolled as rover and rangers in the college and trained for leadership for the service of motherland and mankind.

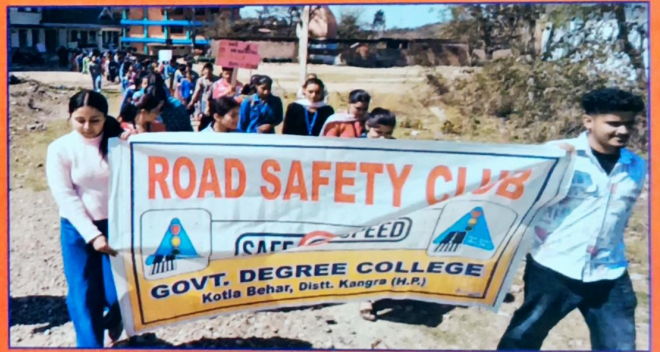
- i. To revive the relationship between the parents and teachers.
